Primarily serving adult learners and/or non-traditional students, the University utilizes National Student Clearinghouse as the primary source to provide information on the types of graduate and professional education in which graduates of four-year degree programs enrolled.

For this analysis, CIP 2020 was utilized.</p> <p>**The student cohort is based on two factors: 1) students who received a baccalaureate conferral during the 2020/21 - 2022/23 years, as defined by IPEDS and 2) students that then appeared in the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) database with a reported CIP enrollment in a graduate- or professional- level program of study following their graduation from the University. For students with multiple records of graduate or professional enrollment in NSC's database, the earliest record was utilized.</p> <p>***Of the 3,495 students included in the student cohort, only 60.63% (n = 2,119) appeared in NSC's database. Of those, only 40.82% (n = 865) have at least one record of graduate or professional enrollment following their graduation from UMass Global.</p>
