### Degree Requirements & Electives

BA Criminal Justice consists of 48 credits in core courses and 3 credits of upper-division electives to fulfill the 51 credit requirement for the program.

Students may choose the elective credits from the following areas of study:

Criminal Justice (CJCU), Legal Studies (LEST), Organizational Leadership (OLCU), Political Science (POSU), Psychology (PSYU), Social Science (SSCU), Social Work (SOWK), Sociology (SOCU) and LBSU 492 (Experiential Learning)

It is possible for transfer courses to meet course requirements within the emphasis area. That coursework must be reviewed by a dean within the School of Arts & Sciences to determine transferability.

**\*Minimum of 30 credits completed in residence at University of Massachusetts Global; 18 of which must be upper-division credits, 12 of which must be in the student's major.**
